Procedures and Criteria for Annual Evaluation

(Approved by Provost Đ May 201)

The DepartmentÕs goal is excellence in instruction, scholarship, and service to institution, discipline and community. To that end, we adopt this spetcoofedures and criteria for annual evaluation. The annual evaluation criteria provincembers of the Department Sociology with guidelines for how to proceed on amnual basiso achieve both departmental and disciplinary standards.

We recognize that an annual evaluation list at cross-section of an academic career and that, therefore promotion and tenure criteria necessarily address adder set offsues. Faculty are urged to regularly review the department of promotion and tenure criteria evaluations are an important part
