Admission Requirements for Special Education

Applicants to the Department of Special Education are required to follow the University's procedures for graduate admission. Admission to the Special Education Master's Degree program requires students to submit* evidence of the following:

- Completed Bachelor's Degree from an accredited university;
- Obtained an undergraduate Grade Point Average (GPA) of at least 3.0 or if GPA is below 3.0, applicants may submit 1 letter of recommendation from (education-related field) employer or current/former university instructor;
- Compose a personal statement not exceeding three double-spaced pages, indicating the applicant's reasons for pursuing a Master's degree and career goals.

Course Requirements for Master's in Special Education

Students completing a master's degree in Special Education must complete coursework constituting the:

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Graduation Requirements for Master's in Special Education

These are consistent with FAU and College Education standards. Each candidate for graduation must:

- The student must meet College and University requirements.
- The student must earn grades of "B" or higher in all ESE courses in the program and will be required to repeat any course in which a grade of less than "B" is earned. (A course can be repeated only once.)
- The student must complete a minimum of 36 credits in the program.
